
How to be a Wildlife Ranger:

Bird Treats!

1—Add some seeds and some vegetable suet/lard into a bowl



2—mix them both together until sticky




3—shape your mixture into balls or use cookie cutters to create a shape. After this chill in the fridge before putting out for the birds!





Common Butterlies


Stand in your garden, set a timer for 15 minutes and see how many butterflies you can find! Want more of a challenge, try a timer for 30 minutes!






Know your prints

Have a look in the mud around your garden for some mammal prints and see if you can identify the different species. If you cannot find any, try putting out a tray of damp sand with some food and see who comes to visit.





Take a leaf rubbing using a crayon or a pencil on a hard surface, then see if you can identify the species of tree from the leaf!







Make your own Butterfly Feeder!



1—Draw out your feeder shape on a piece of plastic, butter and icecream lids are perfect!



2—Cut out your shape



3—Decorate your shape and stick a bottle top into the centre, this will be your food will be



4—Add some string! Use a hole punch or bradawl to create the holes with some regular twine



5—Use an old kitchen dish sponge or bath sponge to create a circle the same size as your lid



6—You're all set! Add some sugar water to your sponge and set it up somewhere sunny in your garden

You can feed your butterflies and bees with sugar syrup, sugar water or remove the sponge and use some chopped bananas.








BIRD TICK LIST WHAT BIRDS CAN YOU SEE?
